JOHN WEEKS, ASSOCIATE DIRECTOR

DALLAS--Dr. James F. Holland, director of the Cancer Clinical Research Center at Roswell Park Memorial Institute, will be at The University of Texas (Southwestern) Medical School March 1-5 as Gifford-Hill Visiting Professor of Medicine.

Dr. Holland, who is also chief of medicine at the Buffalo, N. Y., institution, is current president of the American Association for Cancer Research. He is also chairman of the Acute Leukemia Cooperative Group B and also of the International Union Against Cancer Trophoblastic Neoplasia Study Group.

On March 4, Dr. Holland will present the Gifford-Hill Lecture, "Acute Leukemia as a Model Human Tumor." He will also present a technical seminar entitled "Pandora's Box of White Cells" during his stay at the Dallas medical school.

The visitor's present academic appointment is that of Research Professor of Medicine, State University of New York at Buffalo. He has held a number of key posts with cancer groups and professional societies. He is author of many papers on cancer, particularly in the area of leukemia and chemotherapy.

The lecture is an annual event made possible by a grant to the UTSMS Department of Medicine.
